- Created in response to the need for rigorous EiE research
- Brings research, practice, and policy together to strengthen the EiE evidence base



JEiE: Our Aims

- Stimulate research and debate
- Promote learning across organizations, policy institutes, and academic institutions
- Set standards for evidence in the field
- Define knowledge gaps and key trends
- Amplify under-represented voices including authors in the Global South and countries affected by conflict

Field Notes


Practice-oriented articles documenting programs and/or presenting new approaches to EiE

Double-Blind Peer Review

- Highest standards of academic scholarship
- Peer review is the only widely accepted procedure for evaluating research
- Peer reviewers are:
 - EiE academics and practitioners
 - Matched with article submissions based on their expertise
 - Provide authors comments and feedback for revisions





Criteria for JEiE Research Articles

- Clear research design
- Situate study within relevant body of literature
- Explicit theoretical or conceptual framework
- Rigorous research methods (qualitative, quantitative, mixed) or develop new EiE frameworks
- Original analysis
- Describe implications for the EiE field
- Conclusions supported by data



Avoid Common Mistakes

- Articles must be blinded, do not over self-cite
- Original manuscripts written in English
- State how article contributes to evidence base and advances knowledge on EiE
- Critical analysis, distinct from advocacy pieces
- Clear and coherent language
- 200-word abstract
- Chicago-style [author-date] citation format
