Minimum Standards Update

Outcome:

EiE stakeholders having a comprehensive, current, and unifying global minimum standards framework to ensure that all learners have regular access to quality, safe, and relevant education opportunities in emergencies and post-crisis recovery and to further entrench the INEE MS as an integral pillar of humanitarian response.

Rationale

- The INEE MS were last revised in 2010, over 10 years ago
- Shifting humanitarian-development landscape and changes in global context
- New research and linkages to key emerging issues in EiE



Scope of Update

- Review and assess INEE MS uptake and usage.
- Bring the INEE MS further into the new and evolving international humanitarian context and reflect new learning, needs and priorities of the humanitarian community.
- Encourage and facilitate wider uptake and usage of the INEE MS.
- This update of the INEE MS will not aim to fundamentally alter the core structure of the Domains and Standards as they are still structurally strong.
- Update on contents as well on format and navigation of the handbook.

The actual scope will be determined by the assessment and consultation process

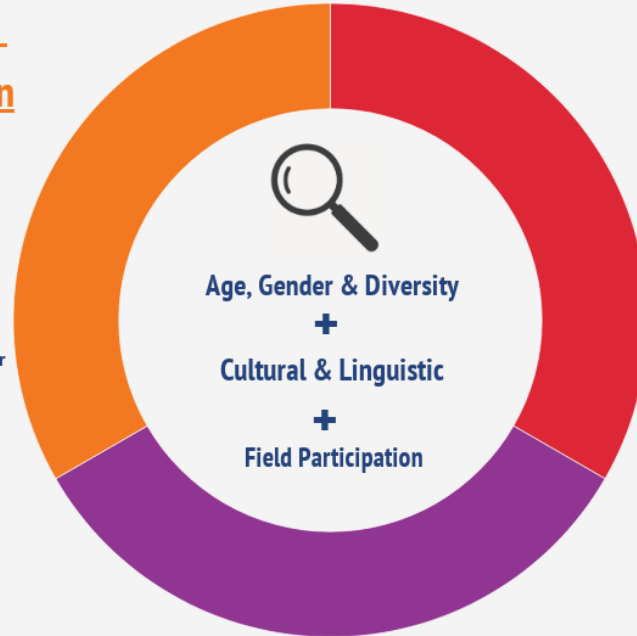

The CoP avails a space where everyone can contribute to the MS update

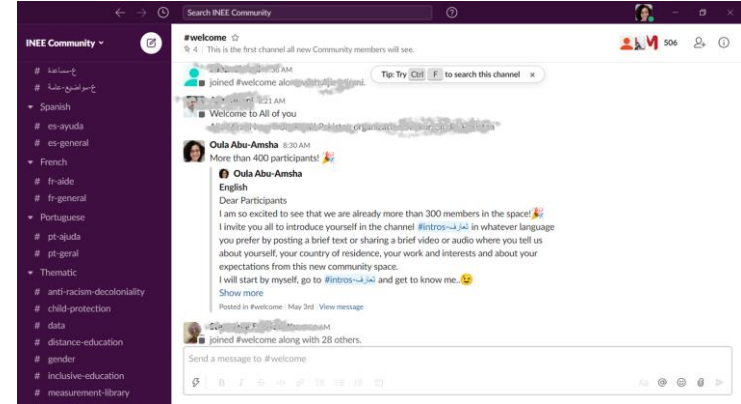
The platform provides:

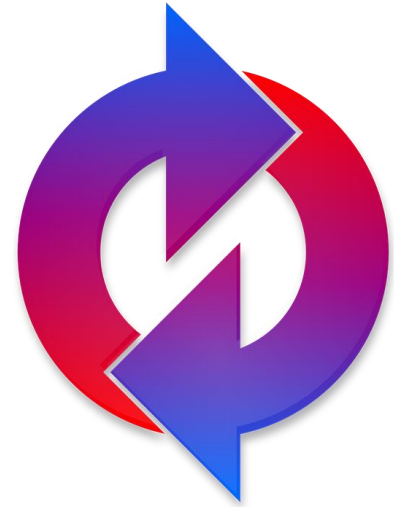


MS Update and the Community

Other Member Engagement platforms

Other member engagement platforms, namely the INEE Meet-Ups and CFPs, will be leveraged to support the INEE MS Update consultation process at the field level.

1. INEE Meet-Ups (next round - October 2021):

- Open and informal gatherings for members to network, share experiences, and discuss topics.
- Although informal in nature, Meet-Ups focused on the MS Update will serve to introduce the topic, get to know members' own experiences, and kick off additional discussions among them through other INEE platforms (i.e. INEE CoP) dedicated for this engagement.

1. INEE Country Focal Points Initiative:


- CFPs are key reference persons at country level supporting among INEE members.
- Currently going through an evaluation process, which will determine the future direction and shape, though CFPs in the next iteration will be very much involved in leading consultations with members at field level.



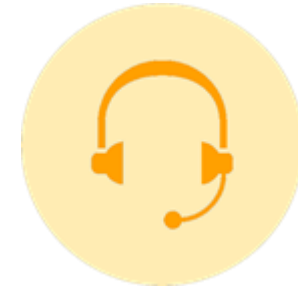
Ongoing use of the INEE MS during this process
