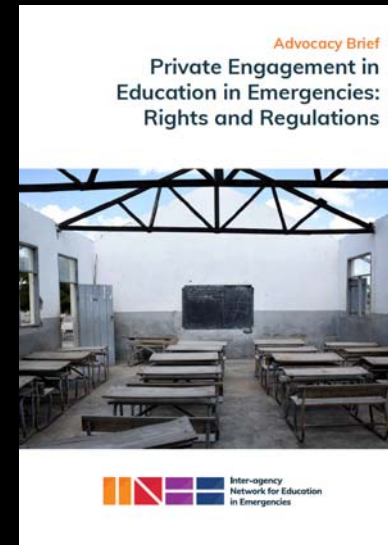

Right to Education

Abidjan Principles

Overarching principles outlining the human rights obligations of States to provide public education and to regulate private involvement in education

INEE Minimum Standards

Standards to enhance the quality of, access to, and accountability for education in emergencies

Defining Private Sector Engagement in EiE

Private or non-state entities include **any actor or organization that is not a government entity, including both for-profit and nonprofit**

For-profit organizations and forms of engagement include **fee-based private school providers, direct business activities, and corporate social responsibility (CSR) programs**

Private actors and organizations in EiE **largely operate through partnerships**

The private sector engages in EiE in a variety of ways, including **financing; provision of goods and services; policy making; knowledge generation and innovation; and advocacy.**

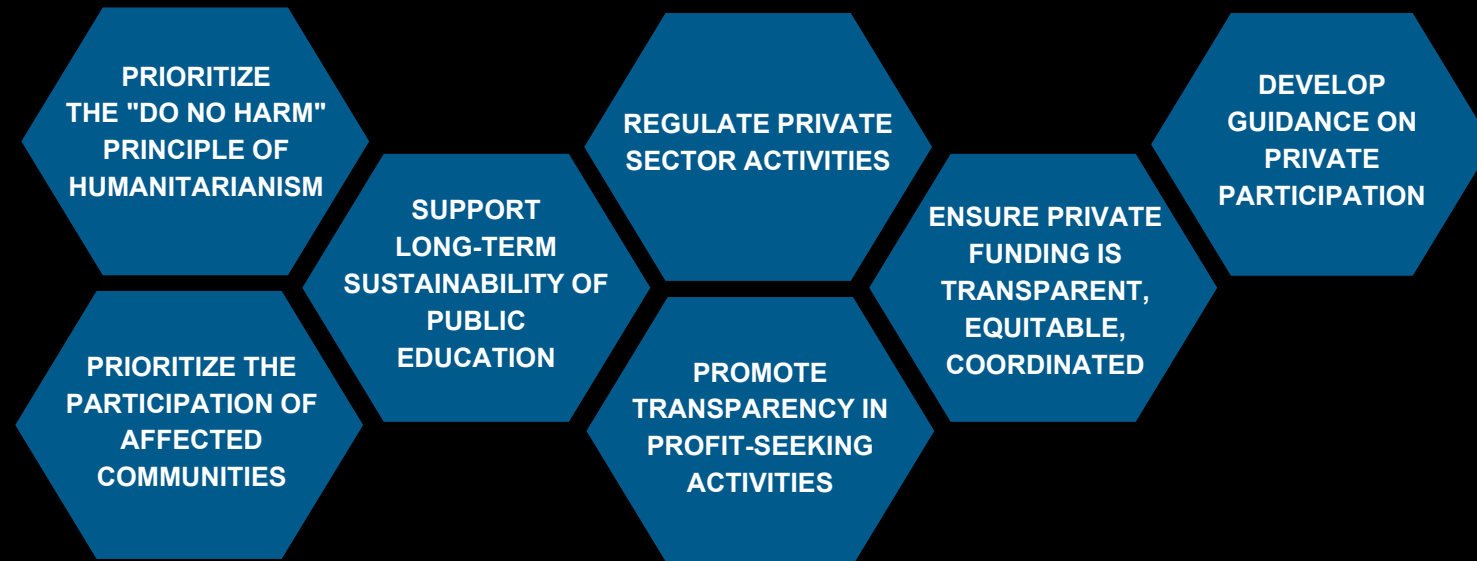
